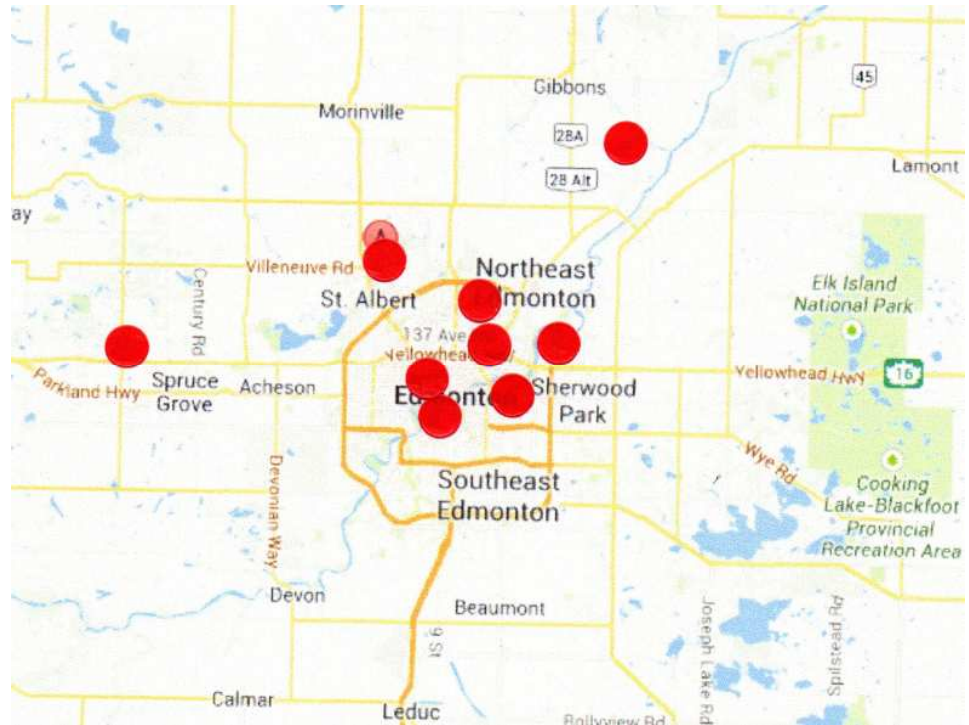

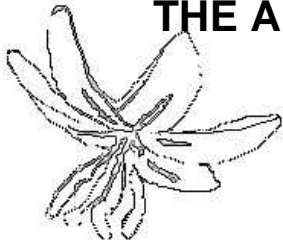

A spot of history

The Saskatchewan Gardener magazine summer 1995 The Frank Skinner Arboretum formally opened August 1995.

Art Delahey and Alan Daku both wrote articles Art's Favourite lilies; Edith Cecilia (Patterson), Honey Queen (Patterson), Golden Princess (Patterson), Bold Knight (Sunley), Dori Jo (Fellner), Parkland Orange (Fellner), Red Raven (Fellner), Brushstroke, Cree, Roma. All lilies with the exception of the Patterson lilies were bred for botrytis resistance.

Allan writes on enduring lilies. Those lilies that have stood the test of time and many gardeners. *L. lancifolium*, the tiger lily, and *L. auricum* and *L. martagon* are the species who have remained for generations in the garden. Asiatic lilies: Pirate, Jolanda, Kismet, Earlibird (Porter), Maxwell (Skinner), old night (Sunley), Red Carpet, Red Velvet, Embarrassment (SIMONET), Malta or a.k.a. Ikaria, Appleblossom, Connecticut King, Kenora, Dreamland, Spacious Living (Fellner), Amulet (Tarlton) Yellow Blaze, Destiny, Sterling Star, Snow Bird, Happy Thoughts (Porter), Brown Ivory (Patterson), Summer Knight, Sun Tan (Barber), and lastly Pink Champagne (Porter).

If anyone has these in their gardens maybe you would like to share your experience with these enduring lilies.

The Saskatchewan Gardener magazine fall 1997 lists two lily related articles.

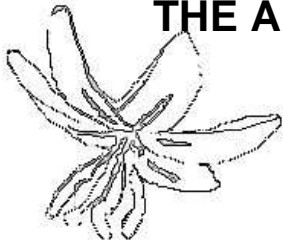
Allyssa's Garden out of Fort St John has a list of lilies from Mak Leek lilies. Some of the listings note Conquestador is similar to Good Night both Tetraploid except Good Night has dark stem and Conquestador has green stems. Nikita is similar to La Toya except half as tall and Bakersfield is quite similar to Grand Cru.

New introductions for 1997 are Sungod (Brooman) introduced by Honeywood and Aurelian Trumpet X Oriental crosses Starburst Sensation (Ronald), Northern Beauty (Ronald), Northern Carillon and Northern Sensation (Ronald, Collicutt) developed by the Morden Research Centre.

SUSAN LEBLANC PRESENTATION ARLS AGM 2014 *Cecilia Bertram*

Susan Leblanc, an active member of the Manitoba Regional Lily Society, since 1994 and their past president, and the North American Lily Society, gave a presentation on Creative Floral Design following the ARLS AGM in April 2014. Susan is a long time Master Gardener and has written many articles and presented many workshops on gardening and floral design. She chaired the Design

Section of the 2012 NALS Show in Manitoba and is working on the 7th Annual Garden Show in the area.

Susan began by stressing the elements and principles of design – she stated that, “When one knows how to blend the elements of design according to design principles, you allow yourself to make designs with creative expression that show order and harmony.” The Elements are: Form, Line, Texture, Space, Color., Pattern, Size and Light The Principles are Balance, Proportion, Scale, Rhythm, Contrast and Dominance,

One should grow lilies for design. White lilies are notorious to work with in design; they show all creases and pollen can be difficult to remove from the petals. Avoid scented lilies in design as they can be overpowering with several in a room. Use lilies that are not completely opened in your design as they need to last the length of the show.



Susan shared many helpful suggestions for creative floral designing.

Containers can be static or show movement – choose one to complement the design.

Curly willow and branches can provide positive and negative space in a design.

Silhouettes, shading and lighting all add to a design when used properly.

Don't go by the judge's decision only – listen to what people have to say.

Don't sweat it! Just do your best.

In a waterfall design, use color in the fall.

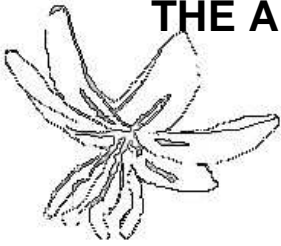
Niches are a way of displaying designs, but do occupy a fair amount of space and you would have to have access from the rear to properly drape the niche and this isn't available at most shows.

Raising arrangements (on a stand – a draped ice-cream pail/books or a wood stand) to eye level enhances the elements and catches the eyes

attention.

When using an oasis place the flower where you want it and leave it there as puncture holes in the oasis allow oxygen to enter and can cause loss of water in the oasis. Pulling the stem out to adjust creates an air pocket at the stem end and water can not flow into the stem and keep it fresh.

NALS Judging article Laurie Hepper

Members of ARLS who show lilies might like to know that NALS has changed their criteria for NALS certified Judges. Below is the new criteria Judges have to follow and submit. The criteria is then given a score to show how much participation Judges have in their regionals. The criticisms of Judges entering stems is no longer controversial as it is requested that Judges should strive to attain higher awards through showing. Judges ethics and etiquette as stated in the judges & showing handbook should be followed to give all entrants a fair chance at winning. The requirement for judges to keep accurate records of their activities is reflected in the variety of questions now asked. Now it is not a matter of Judging other's stems in shows but growing stems to attain awards and keeping active in the Regional. Other floral Societies have this type of criteria so it is not new, just to liliium judging in North America
