Style & Stigma By L. Wilmottiae aka Wilma

I didn't dare go near the place.

L. pumilum and L. amabile wanted to start a new business back then and had decided I should be a partner but this time around I wanted to venture out on my own. They wanted to compete with the Horte Cafe and I wanted to enhance that business by selling my recipes to the Lead Cook to offer those living on Mysteria Lane (and the general vicinity) with a good variety in food fare despite lilies being a main ingredient. Well, that necessitated another Town Hall meeting. Everyone gathered, even the glowing Belles family members, Silky Belles, Creamy Belles, Blushing Belles and Ivory Belles all fluttering their pistols and tepals like no one had ever seen before. It was unusual for these lilium to attend a Town Hall meeting so I surmised that

This was merely another opportunity for every lily on Mysteria Lane to gather for something to do on a nice afternoon rather than staying home to productively plan the upcoming gardening year ~ at least this is how I felt.

I'm still awaiting the outcome of this meeting (and it sure wasn't a gala affair save for the *Belles* clan), as voting was by secret ballot and the decision was withheld and everyone filed out of the building. Head Office in Edmonton. She is passionate about the floral industry and enjoys working with people, teaching and sharing how wonderful the floral design industry is and helping them discover their passion for floral design. She certainly helped the 14 participants find and increase their love of floral design. She got our creative talents flowing and we produced designs that were "out of the box" of the usual modern designs.

Several of the participants were first time floral designers and they produced designs that tell us that they will be challenging those of us who have been doing floral design for several years in the upcoming ARLS Shows.







Iris demonstrated several techniques as we were creating our 'High Style' Free Style Design. The first was how to tape an oasis into a design vessel making certain that we do not cover the centre of the oasis with the tape. Although we do not have to follow any particular rules when creating designs in the contemporary free style, we should be conscious of the principles of design balance, proportion, contrast, dominance, rhythm, scale - as they will enhance our design. She demonstrated how to manipulate leaves by shaping them, rolling them and stabilizing the roll with glue dots/dashes or by pulling the stem through the leaf. The focal point of the design should impact the design but there may be more than one focal point. Complementary colors and open areas of space in and around the design also help to enhance the design. Iris stressed the importance of finishing the back of design to add depth to it as well as to cover the mechanics.

As each participant completed her design she had it judged and critiqued by Iris, a procedure much appreciated as it helped us learn where we did well and where we needed to improve to make our designs more creative and outstanding.

The second project was to design on an armature using copper wire. First we twisted the stem or holder for the armature. Next we shaped and twisted the



wire into a holder for flowers and greens and there was a lot of stomping of feet as we flattened the armatures into shape. Once this was completed we attached the stem and inserted the flowers and fillers to make an arrangement that we tied with bind wire and inserted into a tall vase.

Reports were that it was a very good session on design
