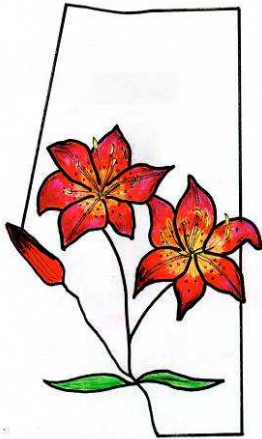

Beetle Musings

lilybeetle@arls-lilies.org Report your invasion.



The lily beetle reporting is active this year. The hot dry weather has allowed wide spread dispersal and I am getting reports of sightings from last year too. The lily show in Calgary collected many more sighting reports. 39 reports in southern Alberta and 1 in Northern Alberta and 1 in Saskatoon 16 of those reports are new sightings from 2015.

So far best reported control is rose dust. Beetles breathe thru tiny openings on their middle and hind part of their bodies, the openings connect to tubes inside that act like our lungs. Rose Dust blocks the openings preventing air to go in or

out, thus killing the beetle.

I'd like to introduce our members to HortusTV--a new service I've just launched in Canada. HortusTV truly is Television for Gardeners.

Like many gardeners I was frustrated by the complete lack of gardening series on broadcast or cable television, so I came up with the idea for HortusTV. It is a video streaming service—similar to Netflix—which allows viewers to stream garden videos. Which as anyone who lives in Canada will appreciate on a cold winter's night when the garden is lying under a blanket of snow and it's months until spring!

HortusTV is subscription-based and free of advertising. Currently the library has over 300 episodes of garden shows from around the world; some are vintage series you'll know and love and others have never before been seen in Canada. The HortusTV library will be adding more content all the time to keep up with subscribers' appetites and interests.

There is a 7 day free trial, with absolutely no obligation. After that, if the service appeals to you, you are able to subscribe for 6.99/ month.

I would very much appreciate your sharing this new service with members of your organization, and if possible bring it up at an upcoming meeting or place a mention in the next newsletter. I'm also interested in any feedback you'd be willing to share, as well as ideas for series you'd like to have added to our library.

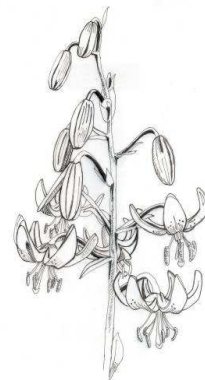

LILY VIGNETTE

Members do you have a lily that you would like to spotlight. I would like to publish info not found in the registry.

My Enigma By Fred Tarlton excerpted from Vol 15 No 4 winter 2000

This fall a number of people have had a lily from me, which was labelled "Enigma". It is a worthwhile lily plant but don't try to find it in the lily register; it isn't there. I call it "Enigma" because that is what it is. I haven't a clue as to its ancestry. Here is the full story:

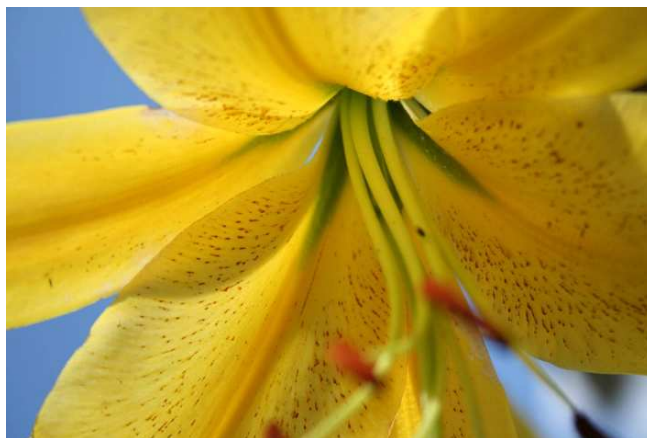
Four or five years ago (1995), I bought a bulb of "Star Gazer" at one of our meetings. When I potted it up, a seedling came up in the pot. It had epigeal germination, so obviously it was not an oriental. I dug it out and grew it separately under light. It made one large leaf that was almost round and nearly three inches across. When it was planted outside in the spring it first sat there without any appreciable growth. The next spring it came up quickly, grew to about three inches high, and stayed that way until we had a hailstorm followed by some four inches of rain. Then it just shot up. Two years ago, I tried to separate a double bulb and had one half of it break into a number of scales. I used the scales to produce a number of small bulbs. These small bulbs are what some of you received after I ran out of full sized bulbs.

The lily is of the reflexed Aurelian type. It grows almost five feet high, has secondary buds and is quite late in blooming. So far it has proven to be hardy.

2015 Annual Martagon Lily Show Report

This year marked the 20th Annual Martagon Lily Show for the Alberta Regional Lily Society. After all this time the Show remains an exciting venue for

martagon growers to bring their stems and engage in a little friendly competition to see who can grow the ideal specimen! This year the spring thaw came early as the snow started to melt in April and by mid-May it was all gone. The conditions seemed to be ideal for a bumper crop of Martagons but with the first week of June came temperatures in the -10 C range. For those in urban centers the impact was less severe than those in rural areas but none the less the result was the same, the loss of many of the flower buds that had already started to form. That left about a month till the July 04th Martagon Show, to see what had survived and would thrive for the Show Display. That did not mark the end of the adversity that lily growers would face as the rest of June was hot and extremely dry which spurred those Martagons that had survived the late frost to bloom early. After 20 years were we going to have a Show?

Of course we would, Martagon lilies are very resilient and those of us that grow them are persistent and committed to positive outcomes. When all the staging was done, there were fewer stems than usual but the 111 stems that made up the Show were excellent. Terry Willoughby and Leo Krupka expertly classified the stems in classes and subclasses in preparation for the judging. Then the judges, Shauna Willoughby and Laurie Hepper, thoughtfully scrutinized each stem with a focus on recognizing the efforts and success of each individual exhibitor. With the support of Dianne Skimming, head clerk, 102 ribbons were awarded; 35 firsts, 33 seconds, 24 thirds and 10 honourable mentions.






There were a total of 10 exhibitors showing Martagons in this year's Show, two of whom were rookies. The Best Lily in Show was awarded for an impressive stem of Brunswiek that was shown by Britta Johnson. She was very pleased with her success as this is only her second year entering stems in the Martagon Show, truly an inspiration to all of those thinking about getting involved in showing lilies. Class VIII was again filled with many impressive newly hybridized Martagon lilies, many of which lily growers will be eager to get into their gardens. The Hybridizers Award was awarded to Terry and Shauna Willoughby for one of their amazing new cultivars, while the Best Alberta Bred Martagon Award went to Ieuan for a seedling from his breeding program. The winners of the First Time Exhibitors Award were Ann and Ken Davis, who brought in a clear white seedling of unknown origins. With the challenging season there were no Collection of Six or Junior Exhibitors. The sweepstakes competition was a hotly contested with Bryan Bennett emerging with the Gold for his 11 firsts, Silver went to Terry and Shauna Willoughby with 9 firsts and Ieuan Evans got the Bronze for 7 firsts. For the 20th anniversary ARLS had potted Martagons available for sale and door prizes, allowing more visitors to add Martagons to their gardens. Door prize winners were: Aman Mangat, Lara Roth, Arlene Tremblay, George Worthington, Annette Smith, Linda Ainsworth, Mary Zaboschuk and ten year old Hayden Resendes who is very excited to grow his lily so he can participate in the Junior Exhibitors in the future. The attendance at the Gardens was down slightly compared to last year but we still had 435 visitors to the Show over the two days. Thanks so very much to the Devonian Botanic Garden for our continued partnership and this year providing maps to the Martagon Beds. This venue allows ARLS to continue to host the Show and display Martagons in the bed as well as *Promoting genus Lilium as an excellent garden plant.*

This event would not be possible without the support of a cast of dedicated volunteers who support the set-up, take down, and hosting of the visitors to the Show. Thanks to Cecilia Bertram, Katharina Durand, Suzanna Durand, Ieuan Evans, Laurie Hepper, Leo Krupka, Dianne Skimming, and Terry Willoughby for all of their support.

NALS2015 Floral Design Section

Flowers and plants nourish every sense but the ear. We were well nourished by the presence of the designs and stems in the NALS 2015 Lily Show in Calgary, AB, and I thank everyone who participated in any way, but especially the designers whose creativity made the Design Section a success.

“Alberta Scene in Lilies” the Floral Design Section of the NALS2015 Show “Celebrating Alberta Lily Hybridizers” took the visitors on a floral design tour of Alberta in 47 designs by 10 exhibitors with their splendid interpretations of the varied areas of Alberta.

I regret that we had no Youth Design entries depicting an Alberta Sunrise in the show as youth are the future of our society.

Three Out of Province exhibitors gave us their versions of **Snowdrifts** using 3 stems of white Asiatic lilies. Pamela Hardy of St. Louis, Missouri won the First Place ribbon for her version. Second went to David Diller from Colorado and Third to Mary Boon of Kelowna, BC.

The Rocky Mountain Streams were depicted in diverse waterfall designs ranging from simple flowing streams to large flowing waterfalls. The Liliium Award for the design that enhances the lily the most and the First place ribbon went to Cecilia Bertram of Edmonton, AB, for her "less is more" design. Suzanne Stack got the Second and Dianne Skimming the Third place ribbons.

Northern Lake Lands was to have a water feature and the creativity of most of the exhibitors came through very nicely, a couple misunderstood the design type. First place ribbon went to Pamela Hardy and Second and Third to Cecilia Bertram and Suzanne Stack.

Foothills of the Rockies – a contemporary design using angles had designers using wheat, grasses, horsetail grass, etc. for angles and flowers and native shrub twigs to create their very interesting versions of this design. Maureen Bexson’s design got the First place ribbon and Cecilia Bertram and Dianne Skimming got Second and Third place. Maureen is from Strome, AB.

A Spatial thrust design was used for the **Alberta Black Gold design**. Dani Dooley of Rosedale, AB, won the First place ribbon and the Best Design in Show for her elegant design. Second and Third place ribbons went to Cecilia Bertram and Maureen Bexson.

Every rancher knows **Roundup Time on the Range** is not a time for relaxing and our designers were very creative in depicting it in a synergistic design that requires they use 3 or more containers. Mary Boon created a very simple design with minimal material that earned her a First ribbon and she also won the Silver Championship Award for the second most First Place Ribbons. We had to go to counting their Second and Third place ribbons as Mary and Pamela Hardy were tied with 2 First place ribbons each. Neither had any Seconds and Mary had 1 Third and Pamela had none.

Prairie Harvest – a vertical line mass design won Dani Dooley her second First place ribbon with Maureen Bexson and Mary Boon getting Second and Third.

For **Aurora Borealis** – a reflective design depicting the Northern Lights, Mary Boon was awarded the First place ribbon and Cecilia Bertram and Maureen Bexson received the Second and Third ribbons.

The Badlands of Alberta – a creative design of the exhibitor’s choice depicting the Badlands included a design with a large rock aptly and beautifully designed by Dani Dooley won her the third First place ribbon for the Gold Sweepstakes Award for the most First Place ribbons in the Show. Maureen Bexson and Cecilia Bertram received the Second and Third place ribbons.

Dolores Nelson of Regina, SK and Marie Wenger of Edmonton, AB, judged the Design Section of the Show and one of the judges reported having a challenging time determining the order of ribbons in some of the design classes. Maureen Bexson and Suzanne Stack did a superb job of recording and tagging the winners.
