Well fellow lily gardeners, our friend Balzac Billy saw his shadow on Groundhog Day (Feb 02) forecasting six more weeks of winter. At the time, I thought we had endured enough cold and hoped the little critter was wrong. As February wore on and the temperatures remained in the -30's, it became apparent the rodent's prediction was accurate. March brought a reprieve from the cold, but it still came in as a *lion* with large

dumps of snow across the province and here we are mid month and our friends in the south have gotten even more snow. Let's all tell ourselves that the moisture will be good for our lilies when Spring finally arrives.

For those that planted Asiatic seeds in January, whether in the greenhouse or under lights, you should have first and likely even second "true leaves" by now. If your passion is Martagons then your seedlings are probably in the cooler chilling already. And for those that can't wait for the seeds to mature and reveal their potential, you may have bulbs in the fridge that didn't get planted in the Fall and are waiting for Spring. FLORAL DESIGN 2018

Although we have written about design types throughout the years, presented is a quick review of the types that might be requested for the 2018 Design Section of the Annual Show.

A **Design that includes water** can be done in any vessel that at least a small patch of water shows with the design placed in the water.

Ikebana can be likened to a story of the relationship of materials to their container and emphasizes the natural beauty of flowers and plants


Nageire means "to throw into" in Japanese. A Nageire arrangement will lean against the mouth of the vase. Any size and shape of vase may be used for Nageire arrangements but tall tubular vases seem to be preferred. Freestyle Nageire expresses the creativity and feelings of the designer. Freestyle does not follow traditional rules, it is not just thrown together. It allows the designer more freedom in artistic choices in interpreting the theme, the expression of the designer and how the materials are used in any of the four basic shapes: vertical, horizontal, slanting or complex.

Nageire is composed of three yakueds called: shin, soe and tai or hikae. The shin determines the overall form of a nageire arrangement:

Important elements in freestyle design are: line (from line material), surface texture (usually provided by leaves), and mass (volume of bunched floral material); points (small focal points other than the main focal point) may be added to the design.

As Nageire arrangements use no Kenzan, it is a bit difficult to hold flowers in the right position inside a vase. We can use crossbars, stoppers and/or wires to support stems in a vase that is opaque, or you can bend the stem to anchor it against the wall of the vase.

There is freedom in the use of colour and choice of mechanics. Plant material, leaves, branches and flowers can be modified by pruning, bending or altering to a desired effect. There is also freedom from the asymmetrical triangle and the rules regarding lines. Voids or open spaces are very important to the arrangement.

ALBERTA REGIONAL LILY SOCIETY OLDS COLLEGE SUMMARY FOR 2017

The work Olds College does in collaboration with the ARLS has several areas of focus.

The lily trials in the Plots area are used for the collection of data on lily performance. This area of the college grounds is used for research and education programming and is not open to the general public. This data collection is performed weekly during the growing season, results are recorded and are then added to the main database, allowing for comparison within a single year or to compare with historical information of the same plant from previous years.


The collection of species lilies and Alberta hybridized lilies are in beds within the Botanic Gardens proper and are available to the public for viewing. Activity in this area is aimed at maintaining and broadening the collection of lily cultivars and *Lilium* species. We aim to keep these collections (Fred Fellner, AB Bred Lilies, and Species Lilies) labeled and maps available on the Olds College Botanic Gardens website so the public can access the information in a variety of ways.

In addition, we continue to gather data on the lily leaf beetle and its control in both the trial plots and the collections plots. We are also investigating the efficacy of the parasitoid wasp in controlling the lily leaf beetle.

A fourth dimension of our collaboration is the promotion of the genus *Lilium* as a desirable garden plant. This is done as part of our public outreach program.

ACTIVITY DETAILS FOR 2017

- Lily Plots
 - Collected data on 60+ different lily cultivars
 - Summary of results are attached
 - Lily beetle infestation was severe this year but kept in check through diligent hand picking.
 Particular attention was paid to the collections within the Botanic Gardens. Certain sections of the Plots were treated with a lighter hand to allow for beetle and larva populations needed for Dr. Fry's research
 - The Plots area was generally edited with an eye to better organization. Ideally the area would have several main subsections:
 - Lilies being trialed and data collected (generally in 3 year cycles)
 - Centennial Lilies being propagated for retail
 - Lily library holding area for lilies in the Botanic Gardens; ideally one each of the collection lilies
 - Research projects currently we are looking at the ability of lilies to adjust to different planting depths
 - o Lilies that have finished trials were removed

• Lily Beetle Research Update – Dr. Ken Fry


 Our student entered all records of lily beetle occurrence in Alberta into the Alberta database managed by Dr. Ken Fry and into the national database managed by Dr. Naomi Cappucino. They also monitored lily beetle populations in the lily plots and assisted in rearing larvae for parasitoid monitoring.

• Botanical Garden Lily Collection - recording, revitalization and culture

- Last year the Fred Fellner bed was renovated with lilies being replanted. The progress of these new lilies is good so far, we will continue to monitor
- The collection around the Gazebo was relocated to the west end of the roses
 - Species lilies, Martagon's and non-AB bred lilies were kept; others were removed (duplicates already existed in the gardens)

• Public Outreach

- The summary of this year's growth trials will be made available on the Olds College Botanic Gardens website as soon as the results have been approved for publication by the ARLS
- Our series of articles has been well-received and there are more that can be published
 - The final two in our series of Lily Basics were published in 2017
 - Calgary Horticultural Society Newsletter
 - Edmonton Horticultural Society Newsletter
- New topics that could be developed in early 2018 include a summary of the 'best' lilies grown in the college plots, fasciation in lilies, lily mottle virus






Pontus Wallsten The Lily Species and their bulbs

ARLS has a trophy that has been awarded the last few years for the ARLS MARTAGON SHOW.

A few years back, in 2010, Una Thompson created and donated a lily needlepoint tapestry to be the perpetual trophy presentation to the Best Lily in Martagon Show. In 2011 the ARLS Board of Directors voted to change the name of the award to the **FRED TARLTON AWARD-BEST STEM OF THE MARTAGON SHOW**. The tapestry was presented along with this award. This small tapestry was usually rolled up and left on a shelf before being passed on to the next winner as there was no way to display it except flat. In 2016 ARLS encased this tapestry into a shadow box frame centrally mounted with small plaques of all the winning stems and the presenters for each year of the Martagon Show displayed within the case.

Unfortunately show records are not comprehensive and not all winning stems and exhibitors are engraved on the plaques for each year.



Remember the beetle emerges at the same time as your lilies and they are fertile. Keep watch. Kill the beetle. Report the beetle. Stir the dirt up first thing in spring to get them as they emerge from the soil. They do not hibernate under the lilies; they could be anywhere, including compost piles, and garden mulch- not necessarily yours.

2017 Lily Beetle Research Update

Dr. Ken Fry, Olds College

Lily Beetle Parasitoid Rearing:

One hundred eighty two (182) lily beetle larvae were collected from the research plots in June and July, 2016. The larvae were fed on excised lily leaves and allowed to pupate in plastic containers filled with vermiculite wetted with tap water. Thirty-six (36) adult lily beetles emerged from the pupae. The remaining pupal cells were placed into three containers. The containers were placed in a cooler at 4°C, in total darkness from September 20, 2016 until June 5, 2017. The containers were placed in rearing cages at room temperature and 16:8 light:dark until emergence.

Fifteen (15) adult *Tetrastichus setifer* wasps emerged between June 23 and June 30. These wasps were released at the Reader Rock Garden in Calgary. The emergence of adult parasitoids confirms the overwintering success of *T. setifer* in central Alberta. No wasps were released on the Olds College campus in 2015 or 2016. Therefore, the only possibility is that these wasps are progeny of the wasps released in 2013 or 2014. Therefore, overwintering was possible from 2013 or 2014 to 2016.

Eight hundred sixty (860) larvae were collected from the research plots and Botanic Garden beds in June, 2017. The larvae were placed into a total of sixteen (16) plastic containers filled with vermiculite and moistened with tap water and fed *ad libitum* on excised lily leaves. The larvae were allowed to pupate and the number of adult lily beetles emerging was recorded (Table 1). Significantly fewer adults emerged from the larvae collected from the Research Plots than from the Botanic Garden Beds.

The remaining pupae in the containers were consolidated into three containers and placed in a cooler at 4°C on September 15, 2017. These containers will be removed in June 2018 to allow emergence of parasitoids. Emerging parasitoids will be released into the Botanic Garden at Olds College, the Reader Rock Garden in Calgary, and one site in St. Albert, Alberta.

Larval Collection & Dissections:

Nineteen (19) plants, randomly selected from a population of sixty-five (65) plants in the Research Plots were sampled weekly over ten (10) weeks for lily beetle larvae (Table 2). One hundred four (104) larvae collected from the Research Plots were dissected and examined for *T. setifer* larvae (Table 3). An additional one hundred (100) larvae were collected from the Botanic Garden and dissected.

The mean number of *T. setifer* larvae per 4th instar lily beetle larva was 9.2 (Table 3). No *T. setifer* larvae were found in lily beetle larvae collected from the Botanic Garden.

Seven (7) lily beetle larvae were collected from the Reader Rock Garden and dissected. None of the larvae were parasitized.




