


LILY BEETLE MUSINGS

This year seems to be more of a trial for gardeners with the little red pest. I had 3 major influxes of beetles. April, June and August had infestations. April as it is the beginning of the 'wake up eat and lay cycle'. June as the Dr Doom I sprayed wore off about the end of May and I only spot sprayed where I saw them. Some parts of my garden did not see Dr Doom until late July then I am still not sure if it was beetle or slug devastation. I think it was mostly slug. Then for those who think the season is over and you can sigh relief, the 'I am an adult I must move out migration' starts from the eggs that made it to adulthood in someone else's garden and are now seeking yours as a new home. Mid August I saw more beetles and larvae so I missed the first bit of them coming in- little *&*%%!. So I spray again as that gets both beetle and larvae **EAT THAT AND DIE!** I also had to fight the slugs this year. And they were into my lilies too. Copper will work to keep slugs away-- be inventive. Ah a use for all those pennies!

2019 ANNUAL 34th LILY SHOW REPORT

152 stems
134 entries
13 exhibitors
33 designs
118 horticultural ribbons given out.
How does this stack up with past shows.?
In 2005 we had 33 exhibitors and 66 designs. In 2001 we had a record 350 stems in the show.
The weather this year had early and late frosts followed by a cool then hot spring, then the rains hit and the development of blooms in the cool wet weather slowed to a crawl. The rural gardens had martagons still in bloom and reluctant Asiatic waiting for warmer climate. Unfortunately, most of our "show selected" stems refused to open for the show and were left in the garden. Even the few cut on speculation that they would open in time for the judging did not, with the exception of one. The stem of Michiganense would have taken the show's Best if it had opened for judging, but it did open for Sunday and gave spectators a great look at a

fabulous species.

Our attendance numbers were approximate but 100 on Saturday and 145 on Sunday is a close number. Our youth show was sadly without exhibits, and no first-time exhibitors decided to brave the competition world.

On a great note we had Lea Romanowski from Designing on the Edge, Judging the Design Show and she had private critiques for everyone entered to help them become better designers. She had enthusiastic praise for a couple of the designs and that is an honour for our semi amateur designers. Keep up that designing edge!

We had many helping hands to set up the show and take it down. While it might take hours to plan, order, reserve and compile stuff, and load the equipment in the van for the show it only takes our experienced volunteers less than an hour to take down the show and pack up the van.

Our guest book shows we had many visitors attending from either being at Greenland or seeing it on their website or Facebook page. Many others heard from friends and family. Some were on the EHS garden tour

and came due to a site rain-closure. We had visitors from Bonnyville, Glendon, Grimshaw, Red Deer Calgary Kelowna, Vancouver and England


